My precious kindhearted wife is at the vet with Rusty now. It's not her first rescue. She started with me. That's a story for another time. There have been more cats and dogs than I can remember. And with all that said, it's not the dog's fault. And it's now our responsibility. Doing nothing is not an option. My wife has taught me that. Anyone need a good used Rusty dog?

Several hundred dollars later, the little guy is resting and has taken over Beau's bed. Beau is passed out on the family room floor. Traumatized I'm sure with this uninvited visitor in his spot. Doubtful.

So, what would you do? We tried to find the rightful owner and the dog was clearly in need of medical attention. We did what we knew to do. Are we out the money? Most likely. Do we really think the owner of this pup is going to reimburse us for caring for their dog? Well, they didn't ask us to. It's not our pet, and it belongs to someone else, and we have been advised to have Animal Control take the lead. Say a little prayer for Rusty the dachshund.

RUSTY

You've heard me say it before, "doing nothing is not an option." In the moment, we needed to decide to deal with the opportunity in front of us, or not. We chose to do something about Rusty. You've also heard me say, "ministry comes with a price tag." I'm no animal activist by definition and yet, I also am unable to ignore a helpless animal or person.

Ministry speaks more to the spiritual needs of a person, whereas ministering to the needs of others goes beyond the spiritual and is incorporated with physical, mental, and social needs. We are all ministers of sorts and all we need to do to help someone, or some helpless animal is to pay attention and lend a helping hand. Be available. Do something!

Be intentional. Stop counting the cost. Ask for wise council and begin by asking God for direction and discernment.

Folks, we all need help. Most of us, if we are willing to admit it, are a little rusty in certain areas of our lives. What if someone was available to help us with our needs, our situations, our circumstances? What if? Without uttering a single word, Rusty screamed help! You could not ignore the fact that he was in dire straits. People tend to mask it much better. We put on our best face, and we grind through life and maybe just maybe, someone is available to help us. Listen to us. Minister to our every need. Would we be so bold as to ask for help? Jesus is a good starting point. The body of Christ is also available to us.

The body of Christ is a community of believers. When we hurt, our whole body hurts. When we are absent, there is a vital part of the whole body that's missing. It may be that we've become a little rusty and in need of a little polishing. Maybe we've concluded that we can't fix things on our own. Please allow the body of Christ to come along side and minister to us. And in doing so, the whole body is ministering to itself.
