I want to share a true story with you today. It's a chapter from my book of life. It's a story that I have shared before and it's a story that you may or may not be familiar with.

This part of the story begins when I met a minister by the name of Mike Baker. You see I had started a little ministry effort entitled Community Men's Fellowship. I'll get back to Mike in a minute.

We started with Monday Night Football poker night. If you chose to play you paid a \$10 entry fee. If you won, you kept your \$10 and the remainder was donated to a charity of your choosing. Several of those men who were not a part of a local church fellowship at the time have gone on to be faithful Deacons and Elders in their respective churches. Praise God!

Then we started playing basketball on Sunday nights at the old Wade School gym. We'd play for an hour, stop, and have a devotion and a prayer time and play for another hour. We had over a hundred different men and their sons come over a five-year span.

It was during this time that I was invited to field a team to go into Pocahontas State Correctional Center to play against the residents of that facility.

The only prison or jail that I had ever been in was when I was in high school. It was an effort to invoke each student with a healthy fear of being incarcerated.

2008 we took our first group in and played against the resident team and lost the game. Like our Wade School format, we stopped at half time and had a devotion. I spoke on the PROMISE – PURPOSE – PROVSION of God.

Then the unthinkable happened. One of the residents, Dan Jennings shared that they needed to be praying for us. I say unthinkable, because we went in the prison to serve these men and when brother Dan said what he said, I immediately discerned in my spirit that I was living in a prison setting. Thanks be to God; I have been set free!

We lost the basketball game by 60 points and God won a deeper place in my heart! PRAISE!

September 2009, I went into preach for the very first time at Pocahontas State Correctional Center and as I entered the visitation room that was set up for worship with a band and choir, I was immediately moved because I had stepped on Holy Ground. God was up to something! God is always up to something!

# -Pastor's Note-

### **GOD IS ALWAYS UP TO SOMETHING!**

To my amazement, the first man I met looked like my dad's twin. Imagine if you can, meeting someone for the very first time and they look identical to one of your parents. Yes, I was taken aback!

The gentleman that I had met at the prison was Chaplain Richardson. I had never seen him before in my life. I would see him a couple more times in the prison when I was preaching or bringing teams in to play basketball and volleyball.

Three months after I had met the Chaplain he called and asked if I'd like to go to a men's gathering at a local church on a Sunday night. I agreed to go, but in my heart, I wasn't really interested.

Thank God the power of the Holy Spirit will put you in places you don't want to go!

After the men's meeting Chaplain Richardson and I went back to my office to share a pot of coffee and get to know one another. There was a freaky connection that I could not explain, and we were about to find out what God had been up to.

The Chaplain said and I quote, "I was amazed three months ago when your name came across my desk."

I had no idea what that meant, and then he began to explain that he was told by his mother that his biological father's name was Doug McDaniel. Then he said that I was clearly too young to have been his dad.

So, I told him about the first time I had met him back in September and how I was awestruck by how much he looked like my dad.

I said Kevin, I'm Doug, Jr and you look exactly like my dad. He would share factoids that his mom had told him and every one of them was consistent with Doug, Sr.

I called my dad the next morning to tell him my story and my dad was speechless. If you know my dad, you'd know that's a pretty amazing feat to shut him up. He's a talker, as is Kevin!

Dad would finally ask me what I expected him to do with this information. I plainly told him that I was the messenger and that he would have to decide what to do. The phone call ended.

Four hours later I got the phone call of a lifetime when I heard my father say, "I have to see this through." I cried!

Two weeks later Kevin and my dad met up, with Kevin's mom in tow. Dad called me to say that they had met and did a DNA swab. Two more weeks would pass, and dad called to say that he was the proud daddy of a 37-year-old baby boy.

And the rest of the story is what they call, HISTORY.

Back to Mike Baker. Mike had asked me to fill the pulpit at Bluefield Community Church when he was out of town, back in 2010.

I was struggling to fill the pulpit, because remember I was living in my own prison. I didn't think that I could measure up. God had called me into ministry when I was eighteen and I had done a mighty fine job of ignoring God. That's a lie! You can't ignore God! You can be disobedient, but you can't ignore the God of the universe.

My heart was hardened, and then God began to break the prison chains in my life. Then Mike Baker said something I will never forget, PRAISE GOD! Mike said, "You are either going to do what God is leading you to, or you're not."

Again, the power of the Holy Spirit moved me into my calling. Thank God for this chapter of my book of life and His continued leading and shaping of my life.

One verse that has meant the world to me over the years is **John 3:30** He must become greater; I must become less. In context John the Baptist knew that Jesus' ministry must be greater than his own.

Spiritually and practically, I had to allow Jesus to be greater. Greater than my excuses. Greater than my weakness and my baggage. Greater than everything in my life. When I began to submit to this important truth, life began to change in ways I couldn't have possibly imagined.

Family of God, allow Jesus to be greater. You won't regret it.

And remember, GOD IS ALWAYS UP TO SOMETHING!

I'd love for you to share a chapter from your book of life.








We also were able to purchase some school supplies for the youth of the church. If your youth has not received their bag, please let Sarah know.


With the school year starting be on the look out for fall activities that are going to be coming up.


