

We struggle daily to know for certain what God expects us to do in various situations and circumstances. The prophets spoke for God to His people who were descendants of Isaac, the son of the promise! These descendants were vacillating between obedience to the law and abandonment of it. By the time that Micah wrote his message warning that God was dissatisfied with His people, especially the northern kingdom and was promising to allow a foreign nation capture it and take spoils back to their home. Of course the Israelites were trying to obey the Law written by Moses and amplified by the various prophets who wrote the books in the Old Testament. They continued to believe that obedience to the "Law" was the only way for salvation. They, very much like we are today, struggled to know the meaning of God's Word and to apply it to daily living. Micah brought a reality to them that, unfortunately failed to sink in then and today. Read what Micah says about what God expects of us:

The LORD's Case Against Israel

1 Listen to what the LORD says: "Stand up, plead my case before the mountains: let the hills hear what you have to say, 2 "Hear, you mountains, the LORD's accusation; listen, you everlasting foundations of the earth. For the LORD has a case against his people; he is lodging a charge against Israel. 3 "My people, what have I done to you? How have I burdened you? Answer me. 4 I brought you up out of Egypt and redeemed you from the land of slavery. I sent Moses to lead you, also Aaron and Miriam. 5 My people, remember what Balak king of Moab plotted and what Balaam son of Beor answered. Remember your journey from Shittim to Gilgal, that you may know the righteous acts of the LORD." 6 With what shall I come before the LORD and bow down before the exalted God? Shall I come before him with burnt offerings, with calves a year old? 7 Will the LORD be pleased with thousands of rams, with ten thousand rivers of olive oil? Shall I offer my firstborn for my transgression, the fruit of my body for the sin of my soul? 8 He has shown you, O mortal, what is good. And what does the LORD require of you? TO ACT JUSTLY AND TO LOVE MERCY AND TO WALK HUMBLY WITH YOUR GOD.

Paul was a student of the Hebraic Law and was a scholar at the time Jesus was teaching in Israel and surrounding areas. After his conversion to become a believer and servant, he also struggled with what God expected of him. He struggled with whether or not the strict law of the Old Testament continued to require obedience to the customs that developed under the teachings of the Patriarchs. He spoke of his struggle in several letters he wrote and in particular inn Romans and 2Corinthians. We, as did Paul, often pray for healing ourselves or others and are perplexed by silence or negative outcomes. A recent commentator stated that during those times "Jesus does not meet our expectations". My belief is that if we reach a point that we actually believe that, we have inappropriate expectations of our Savior. Read how Paul struggled with faith and personal illness:

How Do We [The New Israel] Respond to Negative Events

Ro.7: 14 We know that the law is spiritual; but I am unspiritual, sold as a slave to sin. 15 I do not understand what I do. For what I want to do I do not do, but what I hate I do. 16 And if I do what I do not want to do, I agree that the law is good. 17 As it is, it is no longer I myself who do it, but it is sin living in me. 18 For I know that good itself does not dwell in me, that is, in my sinful nature. For I have the desire to do what is good, but I cannot carry it out. 19 For I do not do the good I want to do, but the evil I do not want to do-this I keep on doing. 20 Now if I do what I do not want to do, it is no longer I who do it, but it is sin living in me that does it. 21 So I find this law at work: Although I want to do good, evil is right there with me. 22 For in my inner being I delight in God's law; 23 but I see another law at work in me, waging war against the law of my mind and making me a prisoner of the law of sin at work within me. 24 What a wretched man I am! WHO WILL RESCUE ME FROM THIS BODY THAT IS SUBJECT TO DEATH? 25 THANKS BE TO GOD, WHO DELIVERS ME THROUGH JESUS CHRIST OUR LORD! So then, I myself in my mind am a slave to God's law, but in my sinful nature a slave to the law of sin.

2 Cor: 7b Therefore, in order to keep me from becoming conceited, I was given a thorn in my flesh, a messenger of Satan, to torment me. 8 Three times I pleaded with the Lord to take it away from me. 9 But he said to me, "MY GRACE IS SUFFICIENT FOR YOU, FOR MY POWER IS MADE PERFECT IN WEAKNESS." Therefore I will boast all the more gladly about my weaknesses, so that Christ's power may rest on me.

When, not if, we struggle with what is expected of us, we must strive to find the humility that comes with submission, self-sacrifice, love, mercy and grace. Submission to God, sacrifice of self for others, love of all people, even those who harm us, through mercy and grace.

1. Little is known about the prophet Micah beyond what can be learned from the book itself and from Jer 26:18. Micah was from the town of Moresheth (1:1), probably Moresheth Gath (1:14) in southern Judah. The prophecy attests to Micah's deep sensitivity to the social ills of his day, especially as they affected the small towns and villages of his homeland. Micah prophesied sometime between 750 and 686 b.c. during the reigns of Jotham, Ahaz and Hezekiah, kings of Judah (1:1; Jer. 26:18). He was therefore a contemporary of Isaiah, and Hosea. Micah predicted the fall of Samaria, the northern portion of the upper kingdom of Israel located from the Sea of Galilee south toward Jerusalem.





More than we can imagine.

Everyone in the area knows Maria Trinidad (or Fela, to those who really know her). For years they have come to her home at the top of a hill in Ciales, Puerto Rico, for school uniforms and party dresses, for trouser hems and alterations. Mrs. Trinidad could look out the window above her sewing machine and see the whole neighborhood. For over four decades, she has looked out over the place she calls home as she has created clothes for her neighbors.

But in September of 2017 Mrs. Trinidad's home was destroyed. When Hurricane Maria hit Puerto Rico, Mrs. Trinidad took shelter with her sister in the back room of the house – the only part of the structure made of concrete – as the wind and rain howled through the hills. After the storm, the two women found the rest of the house in ruins. Debris was strewn everywhere. Yet, in the middle of the fractured rafters and twisted roofing stood a table and on it, Mrs. Trinidad's sewing machine.





In partnership with Week of Compassion, the Iglesia Cristiana (Discípulos de Cristo) en Puerto Rico is helping her piece things back together. Though she received financial assistance from federal programs, the funds would not cover the cost of the extensive repairs. Mrs. Trinidad did not know what else to do when a neighbor referred her to the local Disciples congregation. Disciples leaders soon met with Mrs. Trinidad and began coordinating resources and volunteers to rebuild her home so she can get back to the sewing she loves.
