For those of us that encountered twenty year old Paris Swisher (Ronnie and Gale Hype's granddaughter), we were made better for having known her and her life glorified God!

She had a phenomenal zeal for life and against all odds she chose to overcome and live life to the full, and live it she did! So, that's why I didn't focus on the poem, because the day belonged to the Lord and Paris.

I asked Paris a few months ago about her favorite passage and in pretty quick order she said Romans 8:28 and that spurred us on to talk about all of Romans 8. Take time to read it today. I promise you will be happy you did.

Romans 8:28 (NIV) And we know that in all things God works for the good of those who love him, who have been called according to his purpose.

If you knew Paris, this scripture is such a deep faith statement for her. And it has challenged me to consider many things differently.

From her obituary, "Arriving into this world too early and leaving too soon, Paris was on God's time and His plan."

Parents were told that she may never walk or talk. Paris faced many challenges in her twenty short years and the only thing that got in the way was the "C" word.

But did it really get in her way? Because it seems to me that God took that ugly disease and through Paris' battle, people were brought together. Families were made stronger. God again was glorified!




