I was born into a Catholic tradition and spent the first nine years of my life, as much as I can remember, devoted to the Catholic way of life, thanks to my mom. My parents divorced in 1972 and my mom began taking me and my little brother to different protestant churches in Richmond, VA. I remember Methodist and Baptist churches that we attended and if there was one person that I can thank for seeing to it that I was churched, it would have to be my mom. I was asked to be the Assistant Sunday School Superintendent when I was fourteen years old. My duties mostly involved picking the hymns and leading the congregation in song as we awaited our circuit rider to show up.

When I was eighteen, I became sour to the church. I'd had

enough of religion! I didn't like the politics and the bickering over what color the carpet should be, or how we would go about adding the new education wing. I was done! But, then I met this young woman who invited me to her church and she was pretty and being blinded by her beauty and her soft sweet voice, before I knew what I was doing, I went with her. I said I'd go but that I didn't want anything to do with teaching Sunday school or singing or any leadership positions. So I went, and I held her hand and she held my hand back and she was pretty and I ended up teaching Sunday school and singing and I became a part of the leadership. Thirty-five years have passed and I still hold her hand and she still holds my hand and my God she is beautiful!

Just to think that I could still be sour to the church. Actually what I learned is that I was sour to myself. I didn't like me much and so I had a difficult time liking anyone for that matter, but God sent me an angel and she was pretty....

Moral of the story is when you hold hands with the right people, and they hold your hand back you tend to end up in a good place. Are you in a bad place today? Check to see who it is that you're holding on to.

Hey Lord, you remember the angel that you sent me? You know the pretty one that held my hand?
