The beginning of Pocahontas Kairos #23 was plagued with challenges. 6 days before the scheduled start, an insurrection occurred at another Virginia DOC facility. 3 corrections officers were injured. This put things on High Alert. We don't know what all else transpired but we were told that our scheduled walk was cancelled because of a facility shakedown. It took about 24-36 hours of communication and coordination to determine we had a functional team to deliver the subsequent weekend. We thank God and our Pocahontas administration for alignment.

Our weakened team juggled talks and chapel readings and a delayed start by a couple hours on Thursday. And yet (as always) the Holy Spirit showed up in that gymnasium and God was glorified. Our primary objective is NOT counting the number of men who give their lives to Christ. But yet it is celebrated when it occurs. After all, Jesus told Peter 3X to "Feed my Sheep", not "Count my Sheep". There were so many tears around that forgiveness font this walk.

Just a short story to make this personal..... M was 19 years old when his mother was seeing boyfriend who was unstable. His mother called him and asked him to come to her home, and it was urgent. M showed up to find the boyfriend with a gun and being told by the boyfriend "I'm going to kill you". A struggle ensued and ended with M turning the gun on the boyfriend and killing him. The self-defense claim was rejected, and M finds himself locked up for murder. Now in his mid-20's he showed up to the weekend lost, depressed, searching and seeking a way to forgive himself. Over the weekend M found his voice and found Jesus. On Saturday night after he received his cookies, in the presence of members of the Church Inside, from his Pod, he called his mother. He was so moved that he had to pass the phone to one of the church elders and have them to tell her that he was spending the rest of his life serving Jesus Christ and would be spending his eternity in heaven.

Timothy showed up on Thursday as a member of the Muslim community inside PSCC. One elder of the church and two different pilgrims told me the same story during Saturday. Timothy came out of the Shower Saturday morning singing "This

is the day the Lord has made, let us rejoice and be glad". He even had a Muslim brother (not a Kairos Pilgrim - yet) tell him, "Now I'm singing it too. That song is stuck in my head". At open mic, Timothy told us: "I didn't know that Pocahontas had so many good people in this place. I need friends. I woke up singing, "This is the day the Lord has made'. I'm happy I got to do this".

Bradley told us that his Kairos experience pushed him forward on his journey that he had been struggling. He was proud to announce that he was giving his life to God almighty and His Son Jesus Christ.

One man told us that God is so good. He confessed that he has struggled being a gangbanger for 13-14 years. He cited two of the church elders of helping him learn that God was the way of out that life.

Marcus also cited assistance from one of the elders and mentioned how his Kairos weekend cemented so many things he was struggling to put into place.

Lawrence told a story which related to the Christian Action talk. He recently witnessed one inmate remove his sneakers and give them to another inmate.

Freeman told us what a blessing Kairos has been to him. He said that "this was right on time for me".

For those of you that made cookies or supported us with cookies, here are two stories for you. First, from a Kairos participant, "please tell those folks that make these cookies that they might think these are just cookies.....but to us these are proof that we have not been forgotten, that somebody out there still cares about us, and that there is hope for us. And this from a casual conversation with a Correction Officer entering the building on Sunday morning; "we told the inmates that cookie run would occur as soon as they finished up in the chow hall and made it back to their pods. Usually, men dally around and aimlessly wander back. Last night, there was no wasted time, or motion. Everybody finished and we even saw a couple of guys jogging back to their pods.

In closing, this story came from our Saturday evening cookie run when we hand deliver cookies to inmates in their cells. One of the church elders tapped me on the shoulder and said, "see that cup on the table over there? That is our prayer cup. Every day, any man can write their prayer concerns down and place them in that cup. Our cells are locked for the evening at 9:00 pm sharp." "Each night at 8:55, the members of our church inside gather and pray over that cup, that God would hear the prayers that have been placed in the cup that day." "We never open the slips of paper and read them, but every man in this pod knows that they can submit their prayer requests during the day and they will be prayed over that evening before turn down."

We can't <u>THANK YOU</u> enough for your support in the way of cookies and prayers and contributions. Much like John 21:25, there are so many other stories which occurred this weekend that we could fill a book. Let's just say that God was glorified. -K

If you have made it this far, I want you to know that Timothy sat beside me for four days. He told me on Thursday that he was a Muslim. When he said that, it was like Christmas came early for me. I was so excited for Timothy! Because I knew that this young man was going to get four days of TRUTH. Praise God!

Timothy has signed up for the Christian Church services!

God is good y'all!!
